The recent Federal Election was called on the back of the Abbott/Turnbull Government desperately trying to

smash the rights of workers.

The RTBU joined forces with the ACTU and VTHC in an effort to protect these rights. We invited members to get involved in this campaign. Although we did not tell RTBU members how to vote, we did have one clear message and that message was to put the Liberals Last.

It was the longest election campaign in over 50 years, and we have come out of it feeling proud and united.

I would like to thank every member from the RTBU for your help to fight the Coalition in the 2016 double dissolution election. We campaigned long and hard to get the Australian public to put the Liberals last in order to give the ALP a fighting chance and we succeeded.

We may not have come out on top, however ultimately the Coalition has formed a very narrow majority which can be attributed to the work of millions of union members.

The Liberals went in to the election feeling very secure and confident, with all pre polls and experts telling us that it was over. But what the Coalition failed to understand is that our greatest strength is the fight of a collection of real, working class people. People like you, the RTBU members.

The union movement campaigned at train stations, called union members and door knocked, asking people to put the Liberals last. The work of the union movement this election has been outstanding, with almost every union on the phones talking to their members

The Turnbull Government's anti-worker agenda was evidently rejected by the Australian public, with over 3% swing against them nationwide, and even more in the seats that were deliberately targeted. In some seats, it resulted in a swing of up to 12% which ultimately put some of the safe Liberal seats in doubt.

We have fought the right wing Government's before and we will continue to do it again. Our values stay the same, and I am proud of the efforts of the union movement and all RTBU members that helped out during this election.

No Government is ever perfect, but I am more confident in the future for workers in Australia, given the result that was achieved.
